Fiscal Year 2017 Financial Services & General Government Appropriations Act

The Senate Appropriations Committee approved S. 3067, its version of the FY 2017 Financial Services & General Government Appropriations Act on June 16. This bill provides funding for the Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP). While the Senate bill provides a slight decrease in funding for ONDCP operations, it does increase funding for the HIDTA and other drug control programs.

The House Appropriations Committee approved H.R. 5485, its version of the FY 2017 Financial Services & General Government Appropriations Act on June 22. The House bill also provides a small decrease in funding for ONDCP operations, while increasing funding for the HIDTA and other drug control programs.

It is not yet clear when the full House and Senate will consider the bills on the floor.

Key Policy Riders

House bill - The Committee is aware of and recognizes the difficulty that small and rural law enforcement agencies face with regard to overtime compensation for participation in multi-agency drug task forces. The Committee expects the ONDCP to coordinate with small and rural law enforcement agencies and develop strategies to improve the effectiveness of drug eradication efforts through shared intelligence, technology, and manpower despite limited resources.
